FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs) Math & Science Academy (MSA) Program at PTHS D209

Admissions

1. If I submit an online application, how can I be sure that it was received?

Upon submission of the MSA admissions application at **pths209il.scriborder.com**, applicants can confirm their application by logging in.

2. Can I submit a paper application?

No - All applicants must submit the digital MSA admissions application through pths209il.scriborder.com.

3. What options do I have if my child does not get accepted to one of the MSA programs? If your child does not get accepted into the MSA program, they will attend their home school and take non-academy requisite courses for 9th grade as listed in the D209 course catalog.

4. When will I find out if my child has received an offer?

All students who apply will be notified as to their admissions status by mid-February.

5. How will I be notified of my child's offer?

Students and their families will be notified by email and physical mail using the addresses provided in the application.

6. Is there a waitlist?

There is no waitlist. Admission into the MSA program opens November, and closes on January 15.

7. If my child is not accepted into the MSA program, can they re-apply the following year? No. Only incoming freshmen (8th graders) can apply for the MSA program. The MSA program does not accept transfer students at this time. However, the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma and/or IB Certificate option is open to any student for enrollment starting junior year.

8. My student will be transferring to Proviso as a sophomore/upperclassmen. Can they apply for the MSA Program?

No. Only incoming freshmen (8th graders) can apply for the MSA program. The MSA program does not accept transfer students. However, the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma and/or IB Certificate option is open to any student for enrollment starting junior year.

9. If a student declines the offer, does that open up a seat for another student?

No. Cut scores for admission are determined by enrollment capacity for the incoming freshman class. Additional seats do not open up based on students who decline their admission invitation.

10. Who can apply for the MSA Program?

Any 8th grade student who currently attends a foundation school for PTHS D209; any 8th grade student who currently attends a private school or is home-schooled whose permanent residence is within the PTHS D209 boundaries; and any 8th grade student who currently attends a middle school that is out of district, but whose permanent residence will be within the PTHS D209 boundaries by the start the upcoming school year.

15. Besides the application and assessments, what else do I need to do to complete the MSA Admissions process?

Proviso Math and Science Academy will contact student's middle school to request an official 7th grade transcript on behalf of the applicant.

16. What are the MSA Admissions Scoring Criteria?

^{*} For 7^{th} grade transcripts, there is a concordance scale in which each letter grade has a numeric designation (A = 4; B = 3; etc.) to convert into an admissions score. Non-letter grade transcripts, or standards-based graded transcripts vary slightly in the numeric conversion, and depend on the implementation of grading practices.

17. What assessments will be used for the admissions process and why?

- Math and Reading local assessment from the student's middle school. In most cases this is the NWEA MAP assessment. All middle schools within Proviso Township assess students three (3) times per year utilizing a universal assessment tool. Proviso will utilize student's winter assessment (typically provided in December/January) score. If students attend a private middle school and do not use a math and reading assessment such as NWEA MAP, iReady, or Fastbridge, students can attend one of the four (4) testing sessions available at Proviso Math and Science Academy (register online at www.pths209.org/msa).
- Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test, 3rd Edition (NNAT3) is a nonverbal measure of students' reasoning and problem-solving abilities. Specifically, it measures nonverbal reasoning and problem-solving abilities. It consists of problems that use a complex set of geometric shapes and designs without words or reading required. The test is administered to students from pre-K through 12th grade and is often used to determine eligibility for gifted schools and programs.

18. How many assessments will my child have to take?

Two assessments are required for the MSA Admissions process: Math and Reading Assessment and NNAT3.

19. How long are the assessments?

PSAT 8/9: Approx. 1 hour **NNAT3:** Approx. 1 hour

20. When are the test dates?

Middle schools will be administering their Math and Reading Assessment in December/January and the NNAT3 in November/December. 8th graders in private school, home-school, or transfer

students must pre-register for a testing day using the sign up form found at www.pths209.org/msa.

21. When will students receive their scores on the tests given?

PSAT 8/9: Dependent upon each middle school.

NNAT3: At the conclusion of the admissions process.

22. Do you provide sample questions or study materials for the assessments?

PTHS D209 does not provide sample questions or study materials; however, there are many resources online to help familiarize students and their families with each test.

23. Can my child take the test more than once to try to increase their score?

No. Students are permitted to take each assessment one time only.

24. Do I have to live in Forest Park to go to PMSA?

No - Cut scores for admission are determined by enrollment capacity for the incoming freshman class. The top 250 students (approx.) whose cumulative score is above the cut score will be invited to choose between PMSA and their home school MSA, either PEMSA or PWMSA. The next 200 students (approx.) will be invited to attend their home school MSA program. In other words, there will be 100 academy freshmen invited to PEMSA and 100 invited to PWMSA. All three campuses provide the same rigorous curricular program for students admitted into the program. The only difference is location.

25. Does my residential address determine which MSA Program I go to?

No - Cut scores for admission are determined by enrollment capacity for the incoming freshman class. 26. Are all students who apply guaranteed admission to one of the three campus MSAs?

No. Students must meet the admissions criteria for acceptance. The top 250 students (approx.) whose cumulative score is above the cut score will be invited to choose between PMSA and their home school MSA, either PEMSA or PWMSA. The next 200 students (approx.) will be invited to attend their home school MSA program. In other words, there will be 100 academy freshmen invited to PEMSA and 100 to PWMSA. All three campuses provide the same rigorous curricular program for students admitted into the program. The only difference is location.

27. Can students with IEPs or 504 accommodations apply to the MSA Program?

Absolutely. All 8th grade students are encouraged to apply for the Math and Science Academy Program at PTHS D209.

28. Can English Learners apply to the MSA Program?

Absolutely. All 8th grade students are encouraged to apply for the Math and Science Academy Program at PTHS D209.

29. Does PMSA Forest Park provide bus transportation to and from school for students?

Yes. All students who attend the Forest park campus are eligible for free bus transportation provided by the district.

30. Can students at PMSA Forest Park participate in athletics at their home school? Yes. Bus transportation is provided after school for PMSA students to travel to their home school

for sports. Bus transportation is also provided home.

- **32.** Does the MSA Program include a sibling preference in the admissions process? There is no sibling preference in the admissions process. Some siblings end up on the same campus; others are on different campuses. Families can make that determination once acceptance letters are received.
- **33.** Is there a difference in the MSA Program at PMSA vs. PEMSA and PWMSA?

 No. All MSA campuses provide a high level of rigor and pacing for students who have met the admissions criteria for acceptance. All MSA students across the district follow the same course pathway.

34. What are the benefits of entering the MSA Program?

The Math & Science Academy (MSA) course pathway prepares freshman and sophomore academy students for International Baccalaureate (IB) classes in grades 11-12 should they decide to enter the full IB Diploma Programme or take IB classes for the Certificate option. Additionally, MSA students' grades are weighted, which boosts their GPA for colleges and scholarships. Below is a chart with the MSA course pathways (and course choices) for the core subjects across Grades 9-12.

35. *Is there a World Language requirement?*

Yes, all MSA students are required to take Spanish or French for their first two years of high school. Information on placement will be provided to students upon admission to the program.
