

Applying to College Process

STEP 4: Once you have done your college Search How to apply for college:

- Review your Activities and Transcript/complete a Student Profile Form
- 2) Create and revise Personal essay
- 3) Place your college choices in Naviance
- 4) Request transcripts on Naviance(do this after you have completed the college application)
- 5) Access your fee waiver application
- 6) Complete & Return your NACAC fee waiver to Mrs. Harris
- 7) Use Teacher Recommendation request in Naviance and request recommendations at least 2 weeks in advance of deadline.
- 8) Submit your applications by Nov. 1st and Nov. 15 Early Admission Deadlines
- 9) Submit all applications by December 31st



Undocumented Students And College

Can Undocumented Students Go to College??

100% YES!



Do Undocumented Students need to apply to college as international students?

NO! Most states offer in-state tuition to students who have been in United States High Schools a specific number of years.



Do Undocumented Students qualify for FAFSA?

NO! While Undocumented Students do not qualify for FAFSA, they do qualify for many private and institutional scholarships. In Illinois, the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid(RISE Act) will provide financial aid for Undocumented Students.

RISE Act

• On June 21, 2019, the <u>Retention of Illinois Students &</u> <u>Equity (RISE) Act</u> was signed into law, with an effective date of January 1, 2020. As described in the enacting legislation, the Act provides that "a student who is an Illinois resident and who is not otherwise eligible for federal financial aid, including, but not limited to, a transgender student who is disqualified for failure to register for selective service or a noncitizen student who has not obtained lawful permanent residence, shall be eligible for state financial aid and benefits...".







Prom King and Queen Court


- There will be a contest for candidates to run for Prom King, Prom Queen and Prom Court.
