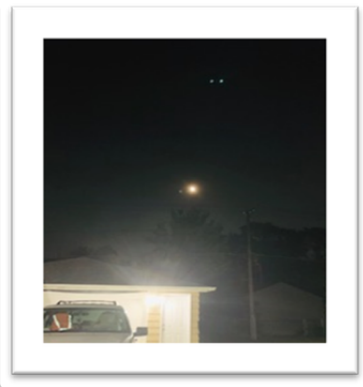

Science



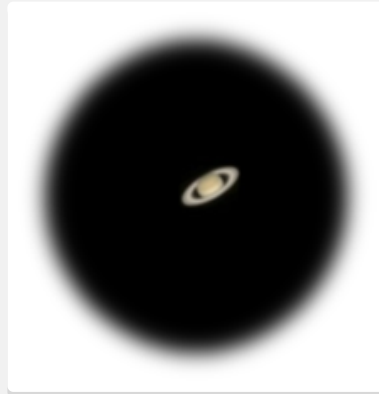

Mathematics

Have you heard about Pear Deck? It is a great tool which allows me to see my students' work in real time, give direct feedback, and share selected student's work anonymously with the class to start discussions. Basically, each student opens a PowerPoint or Google slide presentation, and if a Pear Deck slide is open, the student can write on the slide. On my end, each student's work is "added" to my screen and I can scroll through and see their work, comment on it, and share selected work with the class. The students only see their own work, I see everyone's, and I can choose to share certain ones, again anonymously. I was so excited to share a common mistake with the whole class anonymously.

World Languages

The primary focus for World Language has been to ensure appropriate student placement in courses. Students have been assigned to appropriate levels with minimal disruption to their schedule. Students enrolled in Spanish I Literature and Culture will continue to develop their reading and writing skills in Spanish.

Business

The business department has seen an increase in student enrollment as students have been steadily added to courses. Students are continuing to receive rigorous and relevant educational experiences as they prepare for future technical certifications in MOS. Students are demonstrating skill progression as many students are on track for 'A's and an industry certification.

Family and Consumer Science



Proviso West's Education Pathway is in the works. We are seeking interested students to participate in the partnership with Dominican University that will combine classroom instruction in conjunction with workplace experiences.

On Monday 9/28 and Tuesday 9/29, Textile students picked up student kits that will allow for at home, hands on sewing projects. Students will demonstrate skills utilizing sewing projects presented through virtual classroom instruction.

NJROTC

On Wednesday, September 30th NJROTC conducted a Virtual Award Ceremony to recognize student achievement and participation. The primary focus is to continue to promote student engagement and reinforce NJROTC principles and expectations.

Art

In honor of the International Day of Peace on September 21st, students in the art department have been working on Peace Pinwheels to share big messages about Peace. Music

Student interest in our music program is still high as evidenced by increasing enrollment in music courses and tremendous student participation in Virtual Marching Band.


Technology

The PLTW and Machining Classes are very excited about the anticipated Proviso West Advanced Manufacturing Lab Grand Opening. Students enrolled in Mastery of Metals are working towards the MMS credential. CIM will also participate in the activities that will provide opportunities to earn the MMS credential. Mastery of Metals students have also already successfully earned a certificate from S/P2 in "Developing Effective Communication Skills".

Automotive classes are looking to incorporate at home projects including small engine kit design to reinforce virtual instruction. To increase student engagement, students are using personal vehicles to locate items such as VIN number, oil dip stick, and washer fluid.

Physical Education

Students are learning how to develop fitness programs for themselves or others for lifetime fitness. Additionally, there is a focus on making healthy meals and making healthy choices as a component of physical health and wellness. Students in Driver's Education are preparing for their permit test.



Athletics

The Athletic Office is excited to inform our students about an opportunity to obtain a Youth Leadership Certificate. This is a new virtual leadership program being offered to our students and athletes. IHSA and Special Olympics Illinois has joined together to create this initiative. Students from both the IHSA Student Advisory Committee and the Special Olympics Illinois Youth Activation Committee have worked together to put this program in place. It is being offered for free to all students, with and without disabilities. Upon completion, the students will earn a Youth Leadership Certificate. This is a valuable item for them to include on their resumes and college applications!

The program will run from October 5 - March 15. Each student who signs up will be admitted to a Google Classroom which will house all the information they need to proceed. Each lesson that the student accesses will include a 40-60 minute session with a quiz at the end. Students will have 2 weeks to complete each of the 10 lessons.

Transitional Employment Opportunities

Proviso Leyden Council for Community Action, Inc. (PLCCA) will be providing jobs to community members impacted by Covid19. If you are interested you must meet the following qualifications:

Due to Covid 19 you have either:

- Been laid off from work
- Experienced a reduction in hours
- Have been unable to secure employment
- Were forced to resign as a result of having Covid19, or due to lack of childcare or senior care

Your responsibilities as an employee will include food and PPE distribution 3 times per week. Employees will prepare boxes of donated food for distribution and deliver to individuals who are unable to pick up items. Employees will also work with various community organizations to identify those in need of assistance.

The grant period covers two holidays, so employees will also be involved in preparing and distributing Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday baskets.

The rate of pay is \$20.00 per hour and you will work 20 hours per week for 12 weeks.
